# The Cost of Wound Care in the Era of Online Shopping in the United States

# Introduction

- Historically, post-surgical dressings were prescribed and unavailable at brick-andmortar shops
- Online retailers now offer an expansive array of products available without a prescription, but patients pay out-of-pocket
- Aim: perform a cost analysis of commonly used dressing materials available online

# Methods

- Informal survey of wound care team at an urban academic medical center in 2024 to identify commonly used retail providers and methods of payment
- Four main retailers identified: two retail pharmacy chains, one mass-market supercenter, and one major e-commerce retailer
- Survey of the website to identify the cost of commonly employed dressing materials, using the 14 identified materials in **Table 1**.





### Results

A slim majority of these selected products were the cheapest by unit price on the e-commerce website. However, among the other three retailers who offered both freestanding stores for walk-in service and online purchasing (retail pharmacies and the mass-market supercenter), the cost of supplies varied widely by product.

### Conclusions

- Commonly used wound care products are now available without prescription and online
- The most cost-efficient recommendation is to purchase products online through an e-commerce retailer
